Buyer attendance was limited and with the absence of some major processors the market was significantly cheaper. Heavy bulls sold 10 to 20c easier. Cows were in short supply, heavy and medium weight cows sold 10-20cents cheaper. Bullocks and heavy heifers also in very short supply selling easier up to 20-30cents. A very good run of feeder =cattle were offered selling firm to dearer. Some good pens of weaner cattle were also present with good quality steers selling well, while less quality steers were cheaper. Weaner heifers were softer, selling 20-30 cents easier.
