

Grafton Weekly Market Report

Tuesday 21st OCTOBER 2025

Total Head: 490

Another large mixed quality yarding came forward this week. Buter attendance was good with most processors operating. Cows were in good supply with prices lifting 10 – 12 cents in the top end and firm in the other classes. Bullocks and export heifers sold well, selling 10-20 cents stronger. Feeder cattle were in fair supply with feeder heifers selling firm and feeder steers firm in the heavy end and slightly dearer for lighter weights. Bulls sold well lifting 10-12 cents. Weaner steers sold slightly cheaper due to quality and quantity. Weaner heifers sold dearer lifting 8-10 cents.
