Numbers continue to flow with another above average yarding this week with the prolonging dry continuing. A fair panel of buyers were present with most processors operating. Supply is far outweighing demand at the moment and that is reflecting in prices across all categories. Bullocks and bulls remained fairly firm to slightly cheaper. Cows saw heavy deductions, heavy cows sold 20 to 30 cents cheaper. Medium and lightweights saw bigger losses of up to 40 to 50 cents. Feeder cattle held firm to slightly cheaper. Weaners are really driven on quality at the moment with secondary cattle significantly cheaper.
